What we do

Articles - We publish an article in every issue of the Local Pages about making our lives more sustainable and happier! Last year we published articles on: reducing our plastic use, taking part in the circular economy, electric bikes and scooters, Men's Sheds, reducing our food waste, and about making our homes more energy efficient and cosier. Blue Hearts, Biodiversity and B-Lines!

You will have seen wooden Blue Hearts popping up in verges and open spaces around the village. These designate a No-Mow zone, so that Surrey County Council's cutting contractors will not mow until the final autumn cut. This scheme is part of a national initiative to create more wildflower areas and increase the number of invertebrates on which birds and other species depend. You can apply to SCC using their website and search for the Blue Campaign.

Verges can be managed in different way, for example as a wildflower meadow – Leaving the grass and wildflowers to grow and see what comes up. To maintain a wildflower meadow which is nutrient-poor, removal of the cuttings is needed in autumn.

Bee-Lines of continuous wildflower habitats are being created across the UK by connecting newly-created habitats with existing ones. These are invertebrate 'super-highways' enabling species to migrate, expand their gene pool and thrive. In Ashtead we have added our own Blue Hearts verges to the B-Lines GIS, produced by Buglife. https://www.buglife.org.uk/

We now have some more hand-painted Blue Hearts, which will be available for £8 and we will be selling them at the talk on 28th February in APMH and afterwards. The wooden hearts have been beautifully crafted by Dorking Men's Shed.
